#### INTERNATIONAL MOON DAY:

On 20th July 1969, the world watched two men doing something incredible. Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first humans to walk on the moon. This year, on 20 July 2022, relieve the excitement of NASA's Apollo Moon landings and look to the future with International Moon Day.

In the coming years, there will be a dramatic increase in the number of missions going to the moon. Leading to NASA's Artemis 3 mission to land humans on the moon for the first time was in 1972. As more explorers from different countries and organisations converge on the Moon, a Moon village will naturally develop, via global 'top down' events and local 'bottom up' events. International Moon Day celebrates the Moon as a venue for peaceful exploration and global collaboration.

In 2017, the Moon Village Association was created to foster the implementation of the Moon Village concept. It proposed International Moon Day to the United Nations Committee on the peaceful uses of Outer Space. The day was subsequently approved by the UN General Assembly on 09th December 2021. This year, the theme of International Moon Day will be 'Lunar Exploration Coordination and Sustainability.

#### KHARCHI PUJA:



Kharchi Puja is a festival where the 14 Gods that comprise the dynastic deity of the Tripura community are worshipped in the state of Tripura in North East India. The rituals are observed for a week in the temple dedicated to the 14 Gods which is located in the temple in the state's capital city of Agartala. The festival is celebrated on the 08th day of the new moon in the month of July and it can also sometimes fall in the month of June or August.

However, it is celebrated by both the Tribal and the Non-tribal communities. According to the mythology behind the festival, the earth mother or mother goddess menstruates during this time, which is called Ama Pechi or Amba Bachi. Kharchi Puja is celebrated to ritualistically clean out the earth after her menstruation is over.

A wide variety of sweets are offered as "Prasad". A magnificent fair is organised where cultural programmes are conducted all through the day. Thousands of people take part in this festival. Last four weeks, a public holiday is declared by the government for one day in honour of this festival.
