# <u>The History of Kali Puja:</u>



This is a festival that venerates Goddess Kali, who is the Adi Shakti or Supreme power as per Hindu mythology. Kali puja is also known as Mahanisha Puja and it is celebrated on the day of Diwali. It is observed on the new moon day in the Hindu month of Kartik. Kali Puja festival is not a very ancient festival and its origin dates back to the 18th century. 

# Guljaril Nanda: Frugal and Honest life dedicated to the country

When former Prime Minister Gulzarilal Nanda died in Ahmedabad on January 15, 1998, his family needed just one bag to pack all his personal belongings. A five-time MP — thrice from Sabarkantha in Gujarat — Nanda had no property in his name at the time of his death. The house in Navrangpura where he spent his last years belongs to his only daughter, Pushpaben Naik, who is now 94. Gulzarilal Nanda was interim prime minister on two occasions and was an economist as well. He was held in high esteem by people all over the world, recalling his family members.



Pushpaben fondly recalls what her father was like. "He never allowed politics to influence his family life. Yet he always had enough time for his family. I recall how he had engaged a driver for a car that was used by his family. He never allowed his family to use his official vehicle," she said.

Story of Cat & Rats


